## POLICY & PROCEDURE REGARDING JURY DUTY

## Introduction:

Jury Duty is a civic responsibility, and residents may be called for Jury Duty during residency. If a resident receives a Summons for Jury Duty, the resident should follow this procedure

## **Procedure:**

- 1. The resident should register for Jury Duty over the phone as instructed in the Summons.
- 2. The resident should not postpone service.
- 3. The resident should bring the summons to the Program Coordinator, Gus Chavez, and include the Juror ID Number.
- 4. The Program Coordinator will work with the resident to select a future date suitable for possible Jury Duty, usually during a consult, clinic, or other non-call rotation.
- 5. A Jury Duty letter will be mailed on the resident's behalf requesting that any potential Jury Duty service be moved to a courthouse closer to Olive View-UCLA Medical Center (i.e. San Fernando, Van Nuys).
- 6. Once the letter is accepted, the resident will be put in a "Special Group" and a new summons will be issued by mail.
- 7. On the Sunday evening before the chosen Monday, the resident will be required to call in for Jury Duty.
  - a. If the Juror Group is not called in, then the resident should not be required to call again.
  - b. If the Juror Group is called in for service, then the resident should report in person to Jury Duty on Monday (the next day) and may be asked to serve on a jury.
- 8. The Chief Residents must be notified of any absence from work.
